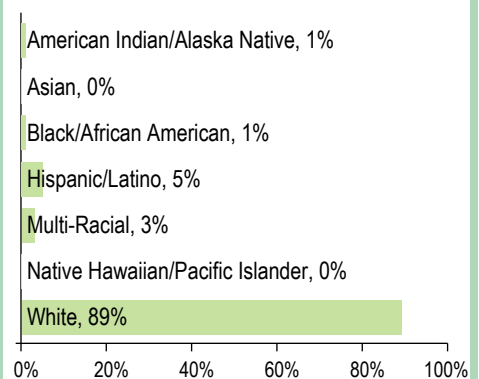

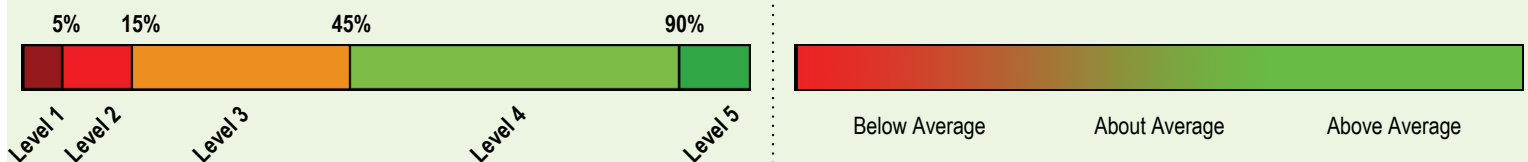

Reading Interventions are available for all students. We test three times a year to assure that each child is getting what they need in this most critical subject.
