## 1.5 Spot Light On Education

Scio Middle School: Nikki Kuykendall presented Middle School Math data. They pulled their data from Smarter Balance Math Scores with math warm-ups to see if they can implement something school wide to improve the scores. This was done in all grades. 6<sup>th</sup> graders to 7<sup>th</sup> graders saw a growth but the 7<sup>th</sup> graders to 8<sup>th</sup> graders didn't see growth in their scores. They will continue to do the fluency with math but with the Language Art scores they found a discrepancy. So school wide they are going to shift their focus back to Language Arts.

Scio High School: Karen Lange presented on chronically absent students. A chronically absent student is considered gone more than 10% of the school days. They are using this data along with their employability scores. 70% of the employability score is on absences. The other 30% is from the teachers on whether the student is working well with others, are they doing their work and turning it in on time. The employability score is something that the high school implemented last year. By implementing the employability score they are targeting the kids that are chronically absent. They want non-chronically absent students to improve by 2% every year. The average employability score is 2.6 out of 5. This is our base line date since this is the first year they have done this. What the teachers are doing is communicating with the students in their Mentor/Mentee classes to help the students understand their employability score and being chronically absent and how this affects when you get a job. More employers are asking for employability score from applicants.

Centennial: April Tate presented Science/ELA scores. In 2015-16 Science scores were above state average. The ELA scores were below state average. In 2016-17 Science and ELA scores were above state average. Glad program was their focus. This is why the science scores soared. For 2017-18 school year they are going to keep working with GLAD.
