This program is free of charge for the district. This curriculum would be part of the Health class. The board would like to talk to the principals to get there input on how this would work for the high school and middle school and to go through the curriculum when it is available. They cannot start the program until after January 2019.

#### 4.2.1. Centennial Elementary School: EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

- We have almost all our teachers coming back this year save one retirement and one resignation.
  Tirzah Langlais will be taking over Special Education, and several staff members came to help
  her move to town a few weeks ago. Samantha Phillips was a phenomenal student teacher who
  is stepping into third grade. The entire staff is very motivated to keep the momentum gained
  the last few years building community and improving student performance.
- Kindergarten teachers are making big plans for the way we transition kids into school. Kaitlyn Brockamp, who moved from fourth grade into music, will also be spending part of her day

supporting this process. Our hope is to improve student relationships and long-term performance.

#### **COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS**

- We are once again having Man on Campus this fall. We had more than a three dozen dads, uncles, and grandfathers spend their day in classrooms last fall, and we love having more men involved.
- Parents Club is on a roll making plans for fundraising and continuing the growth they
  experienced last year. They will be welcoming teachers back with lots of gifts as they help
  coordinate class parties and teacher support.
