## 4.2 School Reports

### 4.2.1. Centennial Elementary School: Enrollment is up again to 318.

#### EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

- Our Wellness Team has created a new Student Leadership Group at our school. It's part of our effort to be proactive and engaging with students who might otherwise opt out of school involvement. We planned to have 12 kids selected from grades 3-5, but with over 50 applications submitted, we've increased the number of kids who can participate.
- Mrs. Brockamp is working feverishly to prepare our kids for their Christmas Concert this year. Having taken over the program this year, she's decided to simplify the program so that more kids are busy singing, and there's a bit less of reciting lines that parents can't really understand anyway. We're looking forward to a new chapter in our arts program.

#### COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

- The Parents Club put on the Gift Giving Fair again this year. It's a great fundraiser for them, and it provides a wonderful place for kids to buy inexpensive gifts for their families. Children aren't allowed to buy themselves anything, and for the younger students, the Middle School sends helpers to guide them through their shopping list.
- Our Holiday Food Drive continues with classes competing to bring in the most food items for needy families. Each year we bring in many hundred food items as classes compete to see who can bring the most. It's a fun way to support students to find joy in giving and in a little competition
