1) CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

1.5 Spot Light On Education

Spot Light on Education presented by Scio Middle School: Mr. Dilts and Marissa, one of his students presented to the Board information about their project of raising salmon eggs in the classroom this year. They received around 150 salmon eggs from the Oregon Dept. of Fish and Wildlife. They monitor the water on a daily basis. They will be releasing the eggs in a few weeks into Thomas Creek. They have only lost around 8-10% of the eggs. Question was asked by board member on how they keep the water cold. Marissa said that they have a machine that regulates the temperature of the water. The board also asked if there are plans to go check up on them after they are released. Do the fish hang out for a while and do they come back to where they were release? They do come back at some point.

Middle School Student Body Council, Quinn Miller 8th grade President and Easton Geraths, Vice President. At the beginning of the school year Student Body Council did team building at a rope course to start the school year out. The Student Body Council reported to the Board a list of events that are happening over the school year. ie, assembles, ghost walk, dances.

2) DELEGATION OR VISITORS

2.1 Staff Reports: Krysta Sprague, FFA Advisor and AG Teacher at the High School, historically is a student took all 4 year of AG they would get their speech credit. Since the student throughout all 4 years of AG do several speeches. Now with the combination of speech and computer lit as communications. About 2 years ago the high school made a decision to combine speech and computer lit and they are now calling this class communications. Mrs. Sprague would like to recommend that her 4-year AG students get the credit for communications for computer lit as well as speech. If you complete all 4 years of AG program at the high school level, you get an AG 111 credit at the college level. Mrs. Sprague has a plan to make sure all students meet all requirements to receive the credit. The students that are seniors this year that need computer lit credit still, Mrs. Sprague would like to meet that qualification as well because they are getting that college credit computer

credit. Mr. Tempel suggested doing this like a proficiency credit and have a list of things the student has to do and mark them off as they do them.

Nicole Buganski made a motion was made to grant proficiency credit in the area of communications, for the future students for the transitioning year where the students can continue classes as either communication or speech or computer lit. Hank McDonald seconded the motion. The motion passed.

3.3 Pedestrian Lights

Mr. Tempel suggested to the Board that they could also put in Pedestrian lights (crosswalk light) for the same price of \$6000.00. Mr. Tempel talked to the City of Scio and they said that in their long range plan had home to school safety as part of the plan and that they are currently working on it. City of Scio had proposed a light down 1st street between the Middle school and Centennial. Over time Mr. Tempel would like to put in 3 pedestrian lights, one at the foot bridge, one down at the stop sign at 1st street and main, and one down at the high school. Mr. Tempel is not suggesting we do all now but do them over time. City of Scio are going to try to get some grants. Mr. Tempel said that the Board does not have to make a decision today. The Board could add it to next year budget and talk about it at the retreat. Hank McDonald suggested that a senior should do this as a senior project. This has been passed onto Mrs. Blackwell to work through to have a senior bring to the School Board and City Council.

4) ITEMS FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE BOARD

Superintendent's Report: Superintendent, Gary Tempel's packet included current enrollment numbers for 2017-18 school year and next year planned enrollment numbers. Enrollment is at 702. Mr. Tempel gave an update on the playground.

4.2 School Reports

4.2.1. Centennial Elementary School: Enrollment is up again to 322. Luke presented to the Board plans for the new playground. The Parent Club is wanting to make changes to these plans to make them ADA assessable.

EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

- Our staff continue to support a culture of leadership at Centennial with focus on The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People. Since being published in 1989, the book has grown into a system of support for schools. Rather than focusing exclusively on the bad behavior and the kids who struggle, this system teaches kids to be leaders who can make a difference in the school.
- Decreasing our chronic absenteeism continues to be a high priority for us as a school. We've
 been more vigilant than ever with family outreach and support. Our attendance numbers are
 looking decent, but we have yet to find the breakthrough strategy. The next step will be to
 post the numbers for the school community to see.

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

 We've begun a conversation throughout the school and community about the downside of technology in the classroom and at home. The education research continues to demonstrate the impact of immersive screen time such as fast-paced videos and games. As these forms of entertainment become more common, we're seeing kids losing the ability to pay attention to complex tasks. As they're used to pacify kids who are upset, we also see kids who aren't able to calm down or follow directions they don't like. Stay tuned for more ideas and solutions in the coming months.
