1.5 Spot Light On Education

Scio High School: Dani Blackwell presented for the Scio High School. Last year the team looked at chronic absent students and implement the employability score. Last year the team said by implementing the employability score they will improve our non-chronic absent students by 2 percent points. This did not happen. We went down but there is a flaw in the data. Our base line was 2.6 and this was flawed because of the PACE students were included in. And they shouldn't have been included. So now our new base line is going to be 3.6. We believe that the employability score will help with the absent students. We also believe that we need to education parents in all that goes on with students being absent. We want to bring in more employers and want them to talk to the students about how important the employability score is to them.

Middle School: Nikki Kuykendall presented for the Middle School. We wanted to see a 10% growth using the Smarter Balance Scores. What we did was implemented a teacher wide/student wide vocabulary list. We choose one or two words each day. They were used in every class throughout the day. This made a connect with the students in all classes. They met their 10% plus more. Their 14% was good but it had flaws. They used the same words for all grades which had the 6th graders saying they have never heard this word and the 8th

graders saying they know this word. So this year each grade level will have their own list of vocabulary words.

Centennial: Luke Zedwick presented for the Elementary School. ELA data in the last 3 years had growth. They continued their GLAD strategies. They had GLAD trainings for staff to go deeper into GLAD strategies. Grades 4th & 5th were above for state average in ELA and 3rd was below. Grades 3rd and 4th were both below for state average in Math. We want to be constantly above state average. Our focus this year is having a Data and Curriculum Team. Also having a Site Council that is focused on writing instruction on the GLAD units.

- 4.1 **Superintendent's Report:** Superintendent, Gary Tempel's packet included current enrollment numbers for 2017-18 school year and next year planned enrollment numbers. Enrollment is at 698. Mr. Tempel gave an update on the kitchen at the elementary school. It is on hold as of now with the county.

4.2 **School Reports**

4.2.1. Centennial Elementary School: EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

- Enrollment is up again this year by nearly 20 students, putting us nearly 50 students more than just three years ago. We've had many new families move into the district, and more transfers in. Second grade grew again this year, but almost all our classes are at a very healthy size.
- Kaitlyn Brockamp is settling in as the new music teacher and Kindergarten Transition Teacher. She's spending part of each morning in Kindergarten teaching social skills and building a healthy community. Then she finishes her day revitalizing our music program. She and Mrs. Stanfield are excited to be working closely together this year.
- Positive reports so far about our kindergarten transition plan. They ended their two-week half-day schedule with very few issues outside the normal kinks we're working out as a staff. Parents and staff report a strong start to our youngest students.

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

- We are once again having *Man on Campus* this fall. We had more than a three dozen dads, uncles, and grandfathers spend their day in classrooms last fall, and we love having more men involved.
- Volunteers are organizing all over campus. We have help in the classrooms, with laminating and cutting, and popcorn every Friday. Teachers love the presence of parents, and we're keeping

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our tradition of Grandparents Day and Man on Campus to give more people chances to volunteer who normally don't make it in.

- Parents Club is not only working to improve our playground, but also spending time in our library as we're working to beautify more and more of the school. It's been great having creative solutions popping up around the building.

4.2.2. Middle School:

Athletic Update

- Fall sports are in full swing. This includes cross country, football, and volleyball. Volleyball has played several games already. Football played its first game on 9/12 and cross-country had its first meet on 9/13.
- We have 12 student-athletes participating in cross-country, 18 in football, and 25 in volleyball.

Education Update

- **Staff Development:**

- The teachers are currently tweaking our school-wide vocabulary building system to help improve our students' reading comprehension skills. We are hoping to continue to improve our SRI, SMI, OAKS, and SBAC scores.

- **PBIS and Student Recognition:**

- Our ASB officers attended a ropes course for team building. They completed 3 activities which required communication, cooperation, and problem solving. One of the activities had high elements, meaning they were 20 feet off the ground. The students had a great time while learning valuable teamwork skills.
- Mr. Jones and Mr. Nolan are planning an intramural flag football league to be played during lunch. The plan is to have several other sports and activities throughout the year. We currently have 12 teams signed up for 4 on 4 flag football.

4.2.3. High School:

Athletic Update:

- Fall participation numbers:

- In the process of hiring a Girls Basketball coach and will begin the search for a new track coach soon.
- Pac West AD's meeting the SOP will be changed for Football gate prices. Adults \$6 and \$3 for students. These prices were driven by OSAA as their standard pricing is Adults \$6 and students \$4. Currently our gates are Adults \$5 and Students \$2.

Education Update:

- We have two foreign exchange students with us at Scio HS. Sergio Gonzalez comes to us from Spain and is staying with the Zedwick family. Aino Strandell is from Finland and is staying with the Lowther family. When asked what are they looking forward to this year at SHS Sergio responded, "Getting good grades and trying classes I could never take in Spain." Aino stated, "Making new friends and gaining new experiences."
- SHS Staff has agreed to continue having a goal of Focused Note-taking for students. Staff will use the five phases of the focused Note-Taking Process (Taking notes, Processing notes, Connecting Thinking, Summarizing and Reflection on Learning, and applying learning) by explicitly teaching taking notes and interacting with them. Staff agreed that this process will occur at least one time during each unit. Due to this continued implementation we are expecting to see more engagement in higher level thinking and questioning as well as a rise in test scores and grades.
