## 4) ITEMS FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE BOARD

- 4.1 Superintendent's Report:** Superintendent, Gary Tempel's packet included current enrollment numbers for 2018-19 school year. Enrollment is at 697. Mr. Tempel gave an update on the playground and gym.

Mr. Tempel presented to the Board a Sports Camera Proposal from Jim Mask. It is buy one, get one free. The cost for 2 camera's is \$5000.00. One would go in the gym and the other will go out at the stadium. These would be used for sporting events as well as graduation, drama, FFA banquets, band concerts, and AFS desserts. The sporting events will cost a small fee for spectators to live stream. All other events would not cost.

### 4.2 School Reports

- 4.2.1. Centennial Elementary School:** Enrollment is up again to 319.

#### **EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS:**

- We are gearing up for state testing in the next few weeks. Teachers have met in grade level teams to use plan how we will use our chromebooks to save time and scheduling complexity. There is also a need to schedule alternate testing environments for kids whose disabilities make the testing process more difficult than a standard school day.
- Fifth Graders are visiting the middle school several times while the sixth grade is at outdoor school. Our program goes above what many districts do to help go smoothly the transition to Middle School. Kids will try out their lockers, meet those teachers who aren't attending outdoor school, and get to know their new principal.

#### **COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS:**

- Parent Club ordered their first piece of playground equipment. This purchase is the largest they plan to make, and will consist of a large, complex play structure. The

remainder of the pieces of equipment will be purchased as funds arrive, and the hope is that some local businesses may sponsor smaller pieces to help complete the playground.

- The Musical Creations had their concert last week. Students from all three schools took part, and many of them have been doing so for years. Community involvement helps make this an important part of the Centennial school year.

#### **4.2.2. Scio Middle School:**

##### **Athletic Update:**

**Baseball:** The season starts with a game on 3/18/19 at East Linn Christian. We currently have 18 players participating.

**Softball:** The season starts with a game on 4/2/2019 at Western Christian. We currently have 11 players participating.

**Track & Field:** The season starts with a track meet on 4/3/2019 at St. Mary's. We currently have 31 athletes participating.

##### **Education Update**

##### **Staff Development:**

- The middle school staff is currently implementing strategies from our last in-service, CPS (Collaborative Problem Solving) Phase I. The hope is to bring feedback, questions, concerns, success stories, etc. to our next in-service which is CPS Phase II.
- The staff has chosen to adopt StudySync for our next language arts textbook adoption. Currently, there are samples for each grade in the district office to be previewed.

##### **School Activities/Fundraisers:**

- The annual 7th grade field trip to OMSI has been scheduled for April 18, 2019.

- The ABC Dance was on April 4th for students with A's, B's, and C's. We had 81 students participate. Congratulations to Sophia Samuels and Demetrius Pate for winning the limbo contest.

#### **Pentagames:**

- We are organizing a 9-student team to participate in a math competition consisting of 5 events.
