4.2.1. Centennial Elementary School: Enrollment is up again to 315.

EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

- We ended the year with lots of positive events. Our "Party of Awesomeness" was for all students this time, regardless of performance. We do this every other year as a way to support kids' feeling included in the positive life of the school. Teachers are leading lots of field trips and fun activities to wind down the year, and students received their final Scholar Awards in May.
- Field Day is the last full day of school, with kids doing activities for a half day and the
 whole school sharing lunch, prizes and awards. End of year prizes include lots of fun
 summer activities, and awards will be given for Citizenship and Most Improved in
 each class. A boy and girl in each grade will be named the Fastest Student at our
 annual footrace.

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

- The Parents Club continues to support the effort to build a new playground. They are currently applying a second time for a Weyerhaeuser Community Development Grant that would continue to build their funds to purchase the supplementary play structures to round out the playground.
- Our school enjoyed an after school family recess. It was well attended, and kids
 played games, blew bubbles, drew with chalk, and more. More than 100 parents and
 families attended.
