Executive Summary

Centennial Elementary School Site Council's mission is to improve the academic success of our school. Any endeavors which we seek to support through professional development and program planning will be considered in light of this mission. To the degree that non-academic pursuits are supported, it will only be with the mission of indirectly supporting academic achievement.

In this year's school improvement plan, Centennial Elementary Site Council has set goals in the following areas:

- Increase student outcomes in writing as determined by work samples and SBAC ELA scores
- Increase student outcomes in ELA through the use of GLAD model of instruction
- Decrease behavior incidents through the use of the Leader in Me program for social and emotional learning

School Description

Centennial Elementary is located in the rural community of Scio, Oregon. Scio is a town of 929 people located 15 minutes northeast of Albany. Scio School District's boundaries reach from Stayton Scio Road, Jefferson Scio Road, Fish Hatchery Road and into Crabtree.

Centennial is one of three schools in Scio School District 95C and the only elementary school. It is located two blocks west of the district office and one block from Scio Middle School. Centennial is a K-5 school with 320 students. Our student- to- teacher ratio is 27 to 1. Our building demographics are as follows:

- 34% free or reduced
- 11% special education, 89% regular education
- .02% limited English proficient
- 48% female, 52% male
- 94% Caucasian, 1% American Indian, 5% Multiracial

Centennial is in its twelfth year of RTI for reading interventions. We have been a PBIS school for 17 years, and Centennial has enjoyed more than a decade of full-day Kindergarten. We are in our fourth year of being a GLAD school in every classroom. We have a strong parent volunteer program, and we feel that Centennial has a very positive school climate.

Summary of the Planning Process

In fall 2019, Centennial Elementary Site Council began to review current student performance data. Staff and school community participated in a needs assessment. Data review, needs assessment review, and collaborative efforts among staff, community, data team and Site Council contributed to the process. Recommendations for modification to the current goals and action plans resulted by shifting the focus of school improvement efforts to include improvement in ELA writing instruction, continued implementation of GLAD instruction, and implementation of the Leader in Me program.

Communication

Site Council includes various members of the school community. Parent and community members were encouraged to participate in the school improvement planning process through Site Council. Parents have been notified of the school improvement planning process and participation through PTC meetings. The Centennial Elementary School Improvement Plan has been developed through Site Council and shared with staff. It will be communicated with stakeholders through the district and school websites.
