Discussion was had with the Board whether the old playground will be open to the public and how we are going to manage this. The Board at this time decided to keep the old playground closed to the public until they have a good plan to have it open to the public. The paving at the High School is moving along.

4.3.1. Centennial Elementary School

EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

- Each month, staff are planning exciting opportunities for student engagement during our Leader Assemblies. For November, our Habit of Focus is Begin with the End in Mind (Make a Plan). Mrs. James’s kinder class modeled the results of making a plan and carrying it out (literally). They presented an Alphabet Fashion Show and rocked it down the red carpet!!!
- The new playground is ready!!! Students are beyond thrilled to get to access the new playground. The ribbon-cutting event is scheduled for November 14th.
- The “Science Guy” visited Centennial this month and hosted hands-on STEM activities for our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students.

- The annual Ghost Walk was glorious! The weather was warm and sunny, volunteers attended in abundance, and students had an amazing time visiting throughout the community!

Athletic Update

- **Staff Development:**
 - The teachers participated in an AVID training on in-service day at Scio High School.
- **PBIS and Student Recognition:**
 - We have our next Gold Card trip planned for November 22, 2019 to reward students for their 1st quarter grades and behavior. Students eligible for the trip had at least a 3.0 GPA and no behavior issues. 58% (88 students) of our 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students have been invited to go. We are planning on going to Oaks Park to roller skate and eat pizza.
 - **Patriot's Pen Writing Contest:** We had several students enter this annual writing contest sponsored by the VFW. We have submitted our essays on "What Makes America Great?" We are waiting to hear the results.


