1) CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

1.5 Spot Light On Education

Mr. Steele reported for Scio Middle School. The Middle School wanted to improve their LA SBAC scores. Each grade is going to have a vocab list that is for that grade and the teachers will give the students 1 or 2 words every single day that they will be focusing on and not only in their LA classes but in every class. During the 18-19 school year they were wanting to see a 5% growth in LA test scores. They did not see the growth that they were looking for. They found that the students were learning more words but it did not transfer into scoring better on the tests. Going forward they are going to focus on the writing summaries but will still have the vocab.

Jennifer James reported for Centennial Elementary School. Centennial focus is on Math. As a team, the teachers came together and developed more complex math questions to get the students ready for SBAC. They looked at ways to track work sample score throughout the year. They also increased the work samples to 4 per year instead of 3 per year. At the end of the year, the Data Team noticed they needed more writing strategies because a big piece of the math is exampling you're thinking. This would help with their writing scores which it also help their math scores. The goals for the staff was to be above the state average. Their action is to raise the bar for instruction. They will do this by improving math curriculum and they will emphasize writing within their GLAD unit. They will also touch on behavioral strategies.

Brenda Broadbent reports for Scio High School. The High School emphasized on Chronic Absenteeism and Employability Score and using AVID Strategies. They looked at the 4 root causes for Chronic Absenteeism; Can't go, Won't go, Don't go and Disengagement. Their hypothesis was that they wanted to attack all four of the root cause so we decrease chronic absenteeism. They truly believe by using AVID strategies they can change those causes and improve the employability scores. In conclusion, they did lower their chronic absenteeism by 2.6%. Their employability grade increased as well.

EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

- Enrollment is up by a handful of students, but we are maintaining the trend of staying in the 300s.
- Kaitlyn Brockamp and Tina Thomas have been a tremendous support in starting the year
 aiding our second and third graders with additional support in reading. To start off the
 year, they have been helping classroom teachers assess the strengths and needs of
 students and building relationships with students through the process. We are very
 fortunate to have them as part of our reading intervention team and look forward to
 sharing out future successes in reading.
- Building relationships and a focus on social-emotional learning have been themes for September. Staff have been revisiting trauma informed practices, reflecting on studentcentered approaches for learning through the social-emotional lens, and centering on their "why." Classrooms have kicked off the year with an overview of the 7 Habits and the meaning of being a leader within the community.

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

- The Scholastic Book Fair was a hit this year! We had great turnout during our Open House. We have raised approximately \$1700.00.
- Volunteers are active and providing much appreciated support around campus. We already have many volunteers helping in classrooms and with classroom preparatory activities.
- Parents Club attended our Open House and hosted a supply station for students.
 Students in need of supplies were able to swing by and pick out items from the mobile supply cart. Students were very excited to do some "school shopping" to get ready for the year!

Athletic Update
