3.2 OHSET:

Christina Cate, Head OHSET Coach and the Scio OHSET Team is asking the School Board if they could make a donation to Scio OHSET Team to help out with their State expenses. State is May 12 & 13 in Redmond Oregon. Mr. Tempel let the OHSET Team an overview of what expenses are reimbursed. The School Board agrees to donate up to \$2000.00 to the OHSET Team.

3.3 Centennial Elementary Textbook recommendation:

The Adoption Process:

We ordered sample materials from all 8 of the ODE "approved" vendors.

We formed a committee of about 8 teachers and specialists.

We then narrowed the 8 vendors down to 3 and watched the caravan videos from the ESD.

Then the committee narrowed the choices to the top 2.

All K-5 teachers had an opportunity to look through the samples of the 2 finalists.

All teachers gave their recommendations.

We hosted a material review for Centennial parents to look at samples and give feedback.

The committee looked at the feedback and made a final decision to adopt the **Savvas Learning's My View Language Arts Program.**

Materials were dropped off at the District Office for School Board review.

Why did the Staff and Committee choose Savvas, My View?

- It is a state approved language arts adoption and aligns with the new state language arts standards.
- Science and Social studies themes are integrated into the language arts curriculum.
- There is a reading and writing bridge where students are introduced to a genre and then practice writing through daily mini-lessons. Writer's workshop is introduced so that students can develop their own writer's craft.
- Whole group and small group instruction are utilized within a gradual release model.
- Suggestions for differentiation, acceleration and intervention are components that ensure all students are challenged.
- Integrates easily with Google Classroom and has some online resources.
- My View Literacy provides instruction through the Science of Reading.

3.4 Middle School Handbook Changes:

Greg Nolan, presented to the School Board the Middle School Handbook with a new Proposed Dress Policy. Middle School is changing their dress code policy to match the high school and elementary school.

Mike Ennis made a motion to approve the Middle School Handbook as presented. Ed DeWilde seconded the motion. Motion passed.

4) ITEMS FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE BOARD

Superintendent's Report: Superintendent, Steve Martinelli's packet included:

Attending to COVID-19 in the 2022-23 School Year

1. Current State of COVID

- o. All Oregon Counties are at low risk levels.
- 1. Predicted to see a slight increase in hospitalizations starting now peaking around 220 hospitalizations on June 6, 2022, before declining once again.
- 2. Philadelphia is the first major city to reinstate mask mandates on April 11, 2022, in response to rising hospitalizations.
- 3. It is more difficult to anticipate cases now because testing has decreased in many areas due to federal subsidies being removed and the cost going up in many locations. So, peaks will only be measured by hospitalizations.

2. Requirements for the 2022-23 school year

o. Every school will be required to have a completed School-Level COVID-19 Management Plan that verifies the school is ready to:

- o. Prevent, detect, respond to, and recover from a communicable disease event.
- 1. Ensure continuity of instruction for all students, regardless of support needs.
- 2. Ensure continuity of learning during and after a communicable disease event.
- 3. Communicate their plan to their staff, students, families, and community.
- a. Local control will continue to be the primary focus at this time.
- b. District has up-to-date emergency operations plan and communicable disease management plan.
- c. OAR 333-019-1030 Vaccination Requirements for Teachers and School Staff will likely stay in place. There are no immediate plans for any updates. The rationale is that school staff are surrounded by a large number of students that are not vaccinated for a great number of hours a day making the risk for spread greater. The only discussions that have taken place are regarding the definition of fully vaccinated and what that means moving forward.
- d. There is discussion about the potential for the vaccination requirement to be removed for volunteers possibly.
- e. There has been no discussion regarding COVID-19 being required for students at this time. If this does become a push, it is highly unlikely that it will occur in the 22-23 school year as the process for a vaccination to become required for school attendance takes a long period of time. And as with all vaccinations in Oregon there is a waiver that parents can request.

4.3.1 Centennial Elementary School

EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS / PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Our newer staff are meeting weekly to work towards becoming GLAD certified. They are also using in-service time to further their training.
- The SEL team did intensive training in DESSA through the ESD.
- K-2 Teachers participated in professional development related to reading intervention called Secret Stories during teacher in-service.

GRANTS

- Through the Early Learning Hub of Linn County, we have received a grant that funds the Little Hawks Preschool Parent Education program. Another virtual class happened tonight and a round of preschool supply backpacks went out over the last few days.
- Through an Early Learning Special Education grant, new supplies were purchased for the sensory room.
- We are currently working with Western Regional Educators Network on a second project related to Social Emotional Learning and building school culture.

COMMUNITY

- 5th Grade is currently doing an Architects in Schools program.
- The Elementary School is currently collaborating with Scio Parent Club to support the 2022 Spring Auction. The silent auction opens on April 25th and closes on May 7th.
