3.2 Summer Lunch Program:

Tracy let the Board know that we no longer qualify for the Summer Food Service Program. Last year we were operating under the COVID waiver. This year the waiver has expired. Tracy has been working with the Family Support Liaison and she is able to get some family food boxes and have those delivered. The average cost for summer food service program is around \$16,000 and this includes payroll. Tracy asked the Board if they want to do the food boxes and miss some kids or do the summer food service program.

3.4 High School Textbook recommendation/adoption:

Scio High School Language Arts Curriculum Adoption

The Adoption Process:

- Both English Language Arts (ELA) teachers from the high school attended a 2-day virtual caravan hosted by the Oregon Department of Education (EDA).
- They reviewed and discussed with other districts to find the top choice of ELA curriculum.
- Both teachers gave me a list of why they selected SAVVAS My Perspectives as the number one choice.
- Materials were dropped off at the District office and notification went out to parents to come to review the curriculum.
 - We did receive some feedback: Parent, “Reviewed Grades 10 & 12 - I wanted to see if critical race theory was being pushed. Was happy to see it doesn’t look like it is. Thank you! Diversity, inclusion, & belonging topics are weaved throughout but the tone seems appropriate and not out of balance. They support voting, kids’ rights, sharing their voices, being “weird” or different, and have diverse tests. I think Scio did a good job of selecting a curriculum that doesn’t push the “liberal agenda” on our kids while still including some of the theses in a balanced way. Thanks!”
