1.5 Spotlight on Education

Bailey Henson, 5th grade teacher at Centennial Elementary School presented to the Board Mid-Valley STEM CTE Hub.

- The Mid-Valley STEM CTE Hub is one of 13 hubs across the state that has multitude of resources, professional development opportunities, and a wellstocked lending library.
- > Starting last year, several fourth and fifth grade staff members began attending meetings for the STEM Rural Learning Collaborative held by the Mid-Valley STEM CTE Hub.
- > Chris Singer is the Project Coordinator for the Mid-Valley STEM CTE Hub and has connected teachers in our district to the lending library.
- Last year the fourth-grade students were able to use supplies purchased with a STEM Hub grant to learn about electricity and conductivity. Students made a circuit and tested the conductivity of different materials.
- > This September Chris Singer and Kelsie Szeszulski brought two buckets of Legos and encouraged students to work together in groups to build an island. The purpose of the activity was to promote creativity and teamwork through the engineering process.
- Our second-grade classes are planning to have Chris come in and show students how to program and use Bee Bots.

4.3.1 Centennial Elementary School

EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

- We have been analyzing the first round of iReady and Dibels results. DESSA, will be
 given over the next week so that we can take a deeper look at student progress
 across the Social Emotional Learning Competencies. Teachers are meeting in teams
 to review student progress and to collaboratively create intervention plans to best
 meet the needs of struggling students. The first round of Student Intervention Team
 meetings took place last week and parents were invited to be part of that process.
- Many classrooms are collaborating with the Mid Valley STEM and CTE Hub.

COMMUNITY

- Centennial Students were excited to cheer on our high school students during last week's Homecoming Parade.
- The Ghost Walk is planned for October 31st. Students will parade through each classroom at Centennial first and will then visit the middle school, the Scio downtown area, and this year they will also have an opportunity to visit Scio High School.
- To recognize Fire Safety and Prevention Week, Scio Fire Department spent two days visiting and educating our students. They were able to visit every classroom.

4.3.3 Scio High School

Principal, Kyle Braa

School Enrollment: 219

Athletic Update:

- Football team is currently 5th place in our conference
- Volleyball currently sits in 3rd place in league standings with conference playoffs set to begin during the last week of October.
- The Cross-Country district meet is a week away. This is the meet that will determine which runner qualifies for the state meet.

Education Update:

- We have three foreign exchange students in the High School.
 - Tim Boehme- Germany (Participating in football)
 - Carlota Chantal Diez Lopez-Nava- Spain

- Noora Holmes- Finland (Participating in Cheer)
- We have 15 students who are participating in our PACE or expanded options program with LBCC.
- We have implemented school wide grade checks each Wednesday.
- We are now tracking tardy data in real time and having daily interventions with any students that are late to class and it is having great success.
 - Week of 9/19 = 99.13% (Baseline data) -Really high mark to begin with 13.4 TPD
 - Week of 9/26= 99.32% (Reduced tardiness by 22.39% for week of 9/19) 10.4 TPD
 - Week of 10/3 = 99.43% (Reduced tardiness by 34.70% from, week of 9/19) 8.75
 TPD

Mr. Braa also commented that Homecoming week went fantastic. 90% of the staff dressed up during the week. The high school had 160 students at the homecoming dance.

Kerri Hyde ask Mr. Braa if the intercom working? Mr. Braa said yes, it is.

Is the High School doing the flag pledge every day? Mr. Braa said we don't do the flag pledge every day, but we can start. Right now, they do the flag pledge every time the student body gets together.

Kerri Hyde asked if the Middle School and Elementary School are doing the flag pledge? Both principals said they do the flag pledge every day.

Do the cheerleaders go to all away games? Steve said he will follow up with Jim on this.
