#### 4.3.1 Centennial Elementary School

School Enrollment: 280

#### **EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS**

- Students are enjoying 30 minutes of music or PE each morning and an additional 20 minutes of PE every afternoon in addition to recess. Research has shown that movement during the school day benefits academic performance, student engagement, and student attitude.
- Parent volunteers and high school cadet teachers have had increased involvement in our classrooms. We have 18 cadet high school students this term.
- The focus of the first two weeks of school has been to build connections and relationships with each student, to work on a positive classroom culture, and to focus on procedures, routines, and expectations. Assessments such as iReady, DESSA, and Dibels are in process and will help us better understand the learning needs of each student.

### 4.3.2 Scio Middle School

School Enrollment: 152

#### **Athletic Update**

- Practices and games have begun for our Middle School student-athletes. Volleyball, Cross-Country, and Football have all had matches, meets, and games played.
- We have 30 students participating in Volleyball, 5 in Cross-Country, and 26 in Football.

#### **Education Highlights**

- Student Leadership We are looking to begin our Student Leadership this month, beginning with our 8th graders and moving to each subsequent grade. Mr. Kelley will be heading up this team and helping our students develop good skills and plan opportunities for their peers.
- Students are Back! We welcomed our students back into the building and our staff is working quickly to learn our new 6th graders. As we have many new staff, we are also working hard to form relationships with our 7th and 8th graders too! We're extremely excited for the school year.
- Open House We are planning for the final Thursday in September for SMS's Open House; contingent upon full access of our gymnasium/cafeteria/auditorium "(gymacafetorium"). We will send a letter home to families (physical and email) once full occupancy is granted.

#### **Education Update:**

- We have moved back to semester schedules at the high school and students now have 7 classes per day.
- We have brought back leadership class at the high school.
- Traditional Mentor Mentee class has been replaced with HS Success and Careers.
- Staff did an excellent job the first week of school setting classroom/school wide expectations and assisting kids. Strong start to the year
- AG has 68 total students 32.22%
- Forestry has 39 total students (25 students are in Forestry I) 18.48%

- High school is offering Art again. 64 total students in 3 classes. 30.33%
- AVID elective has 52 students 24.64%
