REGULAR BOARD MEETING MINUTES

1) CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

1.5 Spotlight on Education

Mr. Alburn presented to the Board Daniel Harper and Angela Cail.

Daniel Harper is teaching science to 6-8 grades and he also teaches AG. In AG they started with beef and at the end of the section they made beef jerky. The students got to make their own marinade. The next thing they did was dairy. They made homemade ice cream. They also turned their own butter and put it on toast. They just got done with poultry and Mrs. Schmidig came in cut up some chicken and they BBQ the chicken.

For science the 6th grade is currently learning about solar systems. After they learned about the solar systems, they had a group project making up their own solar systems. Mr. Harper brought in several of the projects to show the Board.

For 7th grade science, they are learning Mitosis and Meiosis. Mr. Harper is trying to make this as fun as possible. So, they did another art project with Mitosis and Meiosis.

For the 8th graders, they are doing more the physical chemistry. They all got to pick an element. They got to do an art project with the element.

Angela Cail is the teacher for reading and writing for 6th grade and the writing teacher for 7th grade. Right now, our 6th graders are reading the odyssey. They are working on posters for some the monsters. They will also start a log on the chapters they are reading.

For writing for the 7th graders, one of the things they do is spelling and spelling can be a little boring so to try to make is fun Mrs. Cail gave the students a challenge with their spelling words for the week and to either create a poem or create a song out of their spelling words. Sivrin James created a song out of her spelling words and presented it to the Board. The song is about PTSD.

2.3 Scio Youth Club:

Amber Kent-Kutsch with the Scio Youth Club would like to discuss the garage roof again with the Board. She has sent Mr. Martinelli a breakdown of what the Scio Youth Club is out financially. They are out \$3227.00 which doesn't count their football

shoulder pads. They are wanting to know if this is something the school board will be helping with, or can this be done through the school's insurance to help with the loss of equipment? Mr. Martinelli doesn't know the answer to the insurance part of it yet. The storing of the new equipment is being done at different locations and not out in the garage. Mr. Martinelli said that the school district does have a signed quote to fix the garage roof. So, the question is that the building has no value to the district. Once the Scio Youth Club moves to their permanent location the building will be torn down. So how much money is the Board willing to put into the garage to fix it? Or would the Scio Youth Club be better off renting a container to store equipment in? The Scio Youth Club is waiting to see what route the school district is going so they can figure out what they might need to do. The Scio Youth Club got their own quote on the roof. The Board is asking is the container at the grade school is holding up and is it watertight? Mr. Tempel said they are. The cost for a container is about \$150.00 a month. The Board asked Scio Youth Club what their long-term goal is for the club? Amber said that their long-term goal is there are hoping to build in the next 5 to 6 years. The Board would like the school district to turn the loss equipment into our insurance. The Board asked if any of the equipment to cleaned? Amber said she has tried. There is too much black mold on the equipment. The school districts quote on the garage roof for the Scio Youth Club is \$12,500. The quote that the Scio Youth Club has is \$ 6200.00.

Mike Ennis made a motion to cancel our contact and remove the garage at the Scio Youth Club location. Nicole Buganski seconded the motion. Motion passed.

4) ITEMS FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE BOARD

4.1 Superintendent's Report: Superintendent, Steve Martinelli's packet included:

CURRENT

1. District At-A-Glance Report

- a. **Regular Attenders:** State Average 65%, Scio SD 76%
- i. The reduction in attendance percentage directly aligns with the quarantine rules implemented by the Oregon Health Authority and the RSSL guidance.
- b. **English Language Arts:** State Average 40%, Scio SD 50%

- i. Although we find ourselves 10% above state average, we definitely are not satisfied with 50% being our number.
- ii. There has been learning loss over the course of the pandemic and we are hyper focused on how we close that gap.
- iii. We adopted new language arts materials in 2021-22 and are using them this school year.
- iv. We continue to use the iReady assessment system to assess students and help us find learning gaps. This system was purchased using our Student Investment Account dollars.
- c. **Mathematics:** State Average 27%, Scio SD 28%
 - i. Of course, we are not content with this percentage, again the learning loss is evident.
 - ii. We are reviewing curriculum options during the 22-23 school year and will adopt and purchase new materials in 23-24 to be used.
 - iii. We will again continue to use the iReady assessment system for mathematics as well as Language Arts.
- d. **On-Track to Graduate:** State Average 83%, Scio HS 87%, Scio SD 80% (includes WILCA students)
 - i. On-track to graduate is determined by the percentage of 9th grade students that have completed $\frac{1}{4}$ of the credits needed to graduate high school by the end of their 9th grade year.
- e. **On-Time Graduation:** State Average 81%, Scio HS 84%, Scio SD 80% (includes WILCA students)

Kerri Hyde asked how the fundraising is going for the mascot for the high school. Mr. Braa said he doesn't believe any fundraising has started yet.


Mr. Martinelli reminded the Board that there is Board Training on November 30th at 6 p.m. in the Scio Middle School Library.
