# 1.5 Spotlight on Education

Mrs. Roth introduced Chris Singer and Meghan Traeger, the 1st grade teacher, with several of her 1st grade students. Chris, with Mid Valley STEM CTE based out of LBCC, has worked with Scio School District over the years. This year Chris is excited to have introduced computer science into the elementary school, which is a pilot program. Bee Bot Robots is a pilot program that Chris brought into Centennial to pilot with the students. What the students are learning with this program is how to work as a team, and problem solve. It also helps with the student's social emotional wellbeing. The students learn about coding with the Bee Bots as well. The 1st graders are showing the Board how the Bee Bots work. There is a board with colored squares on it and the students roll a dice then program the Bee Bots to go to the colored square that they rolled. Each student got to demonstrate how the Bee Bot Robot works. This is a tool to help the students learn. They can set this up with spelling word list for the week or learn the planets or just about anything and the students enjoy the Bee Bots. The students are asking all the time when the Bee Bots get to come out and play.
