1.5 Spotlight on Education

TJ Kelley, Middle Athletic Director presented to the Board the following:

Learning experience for myself in all aspects (scheduling buses, getting referees and officials, hiring coaches (we hired 5 new head coaches out of 9 different sports), scheduling games and meets, and gameday preparations including the field, equipment, and setup.)

Fall Sports

Football (Coach Jason Donner and Coach Lewis Vinton)

- 26 students participated.
 - 12 8th graders
 - 14 7th graders
- Won 2 out of 6 games, would have been 3 if we had the full roster available, grades.
- Could have used more coaches but they wouldn't have been paid so it was hard to find volunteers.
- Looking ahead
 - Next year's preliminary numbers are: 25 students interested.
 - The Official Association based out of Salem is asking us to supply 2 out of the 4 officials for every home game due to a statewide shortage of officials.
 - We have hired a new head coach Tom Carlson who is bringing more assistants with him as well.

Volleyball (Coach Kaitlin Burson and Coach Sarah Moore)

- 28 students participated.
 - 8 8th graders
 - 20 7th graders
- A very successful season winning about 75% of the matches.
- Received 1 year old jerseys from the HS team.
- Looking ahead
 - Next year's preliminary numbers are: 37 students interested.
 - We have hired a new coach Sam Szmyd

Cross Country (Coach Mollie Donner)

- 4 students participated.
 - 1 8th grader
 - 2 7th graders
 - 1 6th grader
 - Successful season that included many personal bests in the 3k race.
 - Looking ahead
 - Next year's preliminary numbers are: 12 students interested and that doesn't include incoming 6th graders who are allowed to participate as well

Winter Sports

- Tremendous season that included a lot of individual growth and personal records

Baseball (Coach Tom Carlson and Coach Jake Stillman)

- 26 students participated.
 - 13 8th graders
 - 13 7th graders
- Pretty good season with slightly less than 50% of games won.
- Could have used more coaches but they wouldn't have been paid so it was hard to find volunteers.
- The head coach purchased new jerseys for the team and is still currently looking for donations to help offset the cost.

Softball (Coach Meghan Eaton)

- Fundraised \$3000 for new jersey's/equipment.

The Board asked if the ticket booth will stay? Brian said yes it will stay.

The Board asked if the logs can be treated. Brain said yes, the logs will be treated along with the concrete.

The Forestry teacher, Timbre White will provide all the logs and have her class help with the project.

Mr. Tempel informed the Board that there is a process that needs to be followed. First, does the Board have an interest in proceeding with the project? If so, then we would get our engineer in touch with Brian and Ty to make sure there is nothing they missed. Then we would apply for a permit. The third part is whether the Board is willing to provide any funding to their project.

The Board commented that they would like to see the gate opening bigger than 6 feet. Brian informed the Board that there is power and phone line, so they are not able to widen the gate.

The Board asked if the student body got to choose their favorite option to the Stadium Entrance? Brian said, no they wanted to get the input of the Board first.

The Board asked if we could see what the County and the engineer say about the project. The District will pay for the permit and the engineer.

3.3 Donation to the Scio School District Foundation:

Mr. Tempel reminded the Board that Jim Mask, Athletic Director, donated his time as a softball coach. So, in the past you have donated Jim's softball salary to the Scio School District Foundation in the name of softball.

We didn't do a donation for 2021-22 which the salary would be \$3491.00. The 2022-23 salary would be \$3617.00. Which is a total of \$7108.00. If you have a desire to increase this by including all the payroll costs that we would of paid the total would be \$9668.00.

Kerri made a motion to donate to the Scio School District Foundation in the name of softball of \$9668.00. Mike Ennis seconded the motion. Motion passed.

We also had Jim Mask as Coach of the year for the League.

Steve Martinelli asked the Board about a dollar figure for the donation to the Scio School District Foundation to the Turf account in the memory of Bernie Newcom.

The Board asked that Steve bring back to the July meeting the total Board Budget and the expenses for this year.

3.4 Willamette Connections Academy House Lease Agreement:

Mr. Tempel presented to the Board the updated Willamette Connections Academy House Lease Agreement. “Either property can terminate at any time”. In addition, in the lease Willamette Connections Academy added that Scio School District will not enter the building without anyone being there. So, Willamette Connections Academy opted to stop the custodial services that Scio School District provided on June 30, 2023.

3.9 Math Curriculum Adoption:

Centennial Math Curriculum Adoption

The Adoption Process:

- Sample materials from all of the ODE “approved” vendors were collected.
- A committee of about 8 teachers and specialists reviewed the materials and brought them to their teams for further review.
- Vendors were narrowed to 4 and teaching staff watched live presentations from each.
- All teachers gave their recommendations.
- Centennial parents were offered an opportunity to look at the top two samples and give feedback.
- Materials were available for School Board review.
- The committee looked at the feedback and made a final decision to adopt ***Oregon Math, by Big Ideas Learning***

Why did our team choose ***Oregon Math by Big Ideas Learning***?

- It is a focused, rigorous, and comprehensive K-12 math program that 100% aligns to current Oregon Mathematics Standards.
- Oregon Math, is a rich mathematics curriculum that has hands-on materials, a fluency skill building workbook, parent support pages, traditional workbooks, along with an online component for teachers and students.
- Oregon Math encourages students to become strategic thinkers and problem solvers, and emphasizes Oregon Mathematical Practice Standards.
- The program embraces Dr. John Hattie’s Visible Learning Research.
- *Learning Targets* and *Success Criteria* provide a framework to help students and teachers understand the intention of each lesson, and a means of assessing student learning.
- Real life applications, along with intervention and acceleration progressions are provided within the text.

The Adoption Process:

- We looked at two approved ODE Math Curriculum Vendors
 - Houghton Mifflin Harcourt - INTO MATH
 - EdGems Inc - EdGems Math
- Mrs. McClatchey and Mr. Alburn reviewed the materials and gave access for all other math teachers to review the materials
- Mrs. McClatchey and Mr. Alburn gave their recommendations.
- SMS parents were offered an opportunity to look at the top two samples and give feedback.
- Materials were available for community review.
- The committee looked at the feedback and made a final decision to adopt ***EdGems Math, by EdGems Inc***

Why did our team choose *EdGems Math by EdGems Inc*?

- It is a focused, rigorous, and comprehensive 6-8 math program that aligns to current Oregon Mathematics Standards.
- EdGems Math is authored by a respected author and her team
- EdGems Math encourages students to become strategic thinkers and problem solvers, and emphasizes Oregon Mathematical Practice Standards.
- Real life applications are abundant throughout the student examples and work.
- Teachers have access to online resources and interventions.

3.10 Drivers Ed:

Steve Martinelli has had a couple of inquiries around letting Students outside of Scio boundaries to come in and take the drivers ed class. We do not charge our Scio students a fee for drivers ed. Mr. Shown only had 4 students signed up for drivers ed for the summer class. We need around 20-25 per class because of the cost of the instructor and wear and tear on the drivers ed car. So, the summer class was cancelled. These 4 students will be able to take the fall session. The District has done a cost analysis on what it would cost students including ours and students outside of Scio boundaries. It works out to be about \$300.00 a student to be able to offer drivers ed.

The Board asked Steve to bring this back to the Board in a future meeting.


