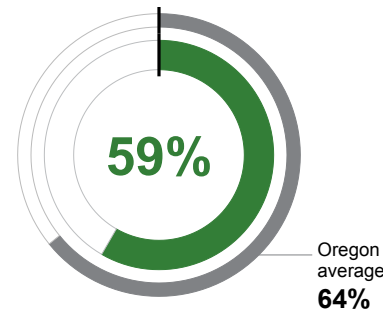
#### CLASS SIZE

#### INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

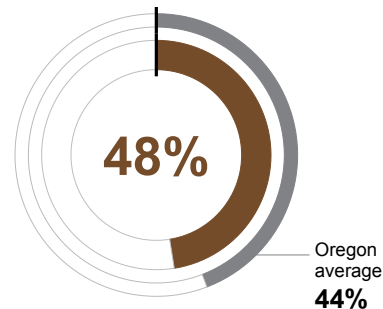

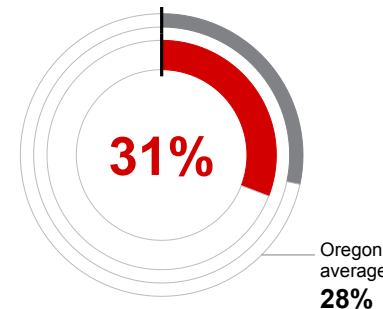
#### ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



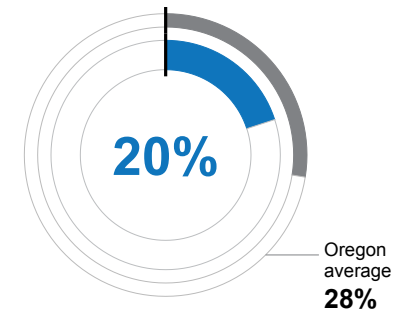
#### MATHEMATICS

### About Our School

#### BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

To ensure a safe and secure learning environment for all our students, our school has implemented elements of Second Steps during assemblies. These assemblies include the entire student body and include such topics as: empathy, anger management, and problem solving. Our staff has been trained in Circle Point Bullying Prevention Program, which is a research-based, multi-mechanism community empowerment program that provides schools with practical and effective solutions to bullying problems.

#### EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our school offers several academic extracurricular activities: Oregon Battle of the Books, Pentagames, and Chess Club. Our school offers several athletic extracurricular activities: cross-country, football, volleyball, boys' basketball, girls' basketball, wrestling, softball, baseball, and track & field. Our school offers several intramural sports: flag-football, 3 on 3 basketball, and pickle ball.

#### PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Our school engages parents by including them in our Student of the Month assemblies, chaperoning dances and field trips, helping with the annual Ghost Walk event, and supervising the carnival events at the Spring Fling.
