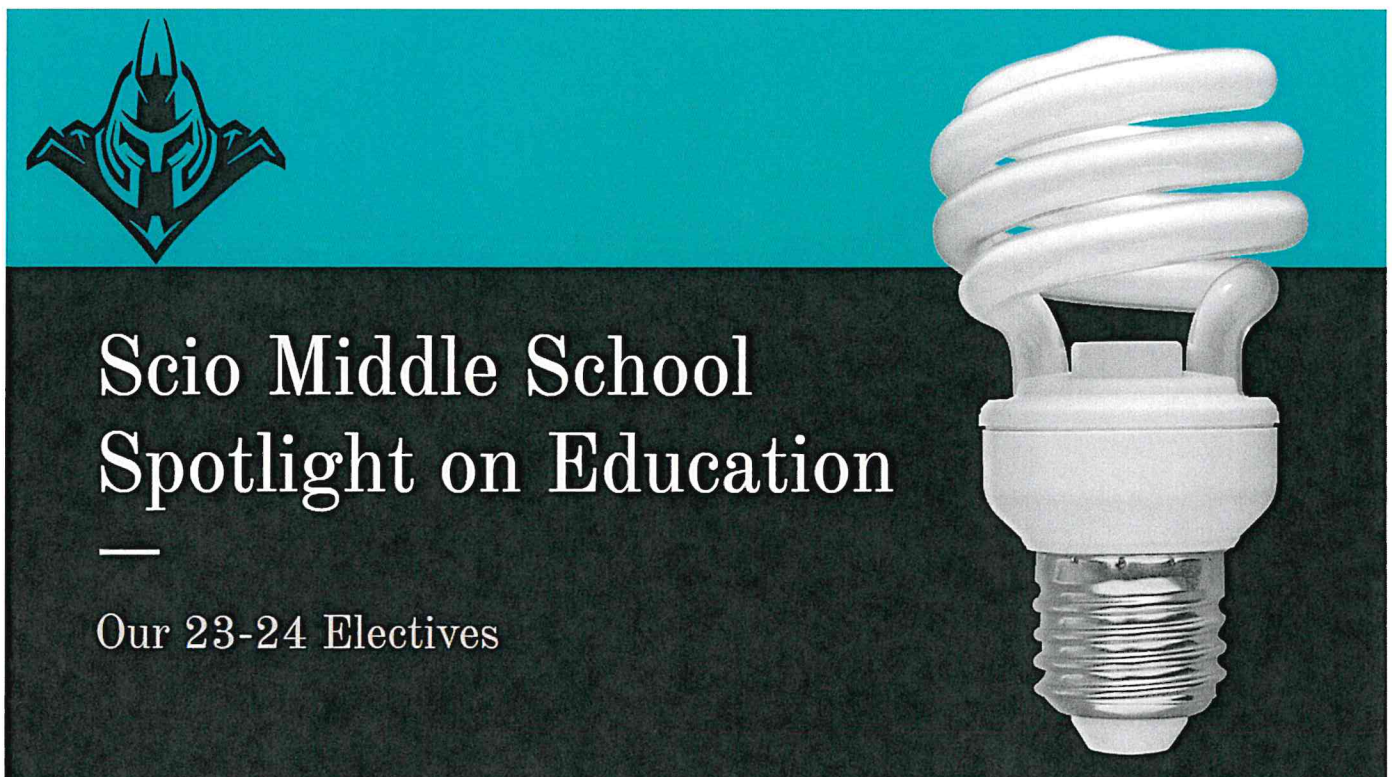

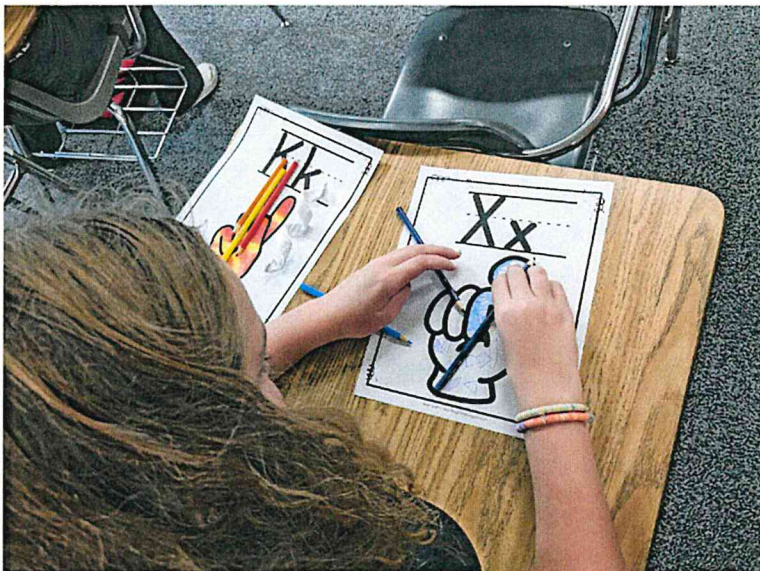

We are paying the certified substitutes less than last year but the reason that this came about is when we moved to Edustaff they said here is the state rate and everyone around us pays that same rate. The way the rate was calculated we had to include those 6 days in the substitute rate.
