Dear Austin:

Alpha Environmental Services, Inc. performed a short-term Radon Measurement Screening at the above-referenced address from 12/19/2022 to 12/21/2022. The testing was conducted throughout elementary school. These test results represent the conditions that existed with respect to weather and operating conditions of the home during the time period tested.

AirChek radon charcoal-activitated test kits were utilized for this testing procedure.

Results of radon testing are included at the end of this report. All radon levels were below 2.0 pCi/L, which is the lowest threshold mitigation is typically considered.

According to the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) *Home Buyer's and Seller's Guide to Radon* the recommendation is to mitigate (fix) the home if the average is 4.0 pCi/L or more and to consider mitigation if the average is between 2.0 pCi/L and 4.0 pCi/L.

In any case, the EPA recommends retesting about every two years or following changes to your home such as new windows, insulating, sealing, remodeling or similar activities. Alpha recommends a long-term test when the initial short-term test was less than the NAL (National Action Level) of 4.0 pCi/L.

PURPOSE OF THIS INSPECTION REPORT

To provide a professional opinion of a structure's radon levels at the time of the test period, limited to the conditions identified in this report.

EPA EXPLANATION OF TEST RESULTS

Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer, after smoking. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Surgeon General strongly recommend taking further action when the home's radon test results are **4.0** pCi/l (picocuries per liter of air) or greater. Radon levels less than **4.0** pCi/l still pose some risk and in many cases may be reduced. The national average indoor radon level is about 1.3 pCi/l while outdoor radon levels average 0.4 pCi/l. The higher a home's radon level, the greater the health risk to you and your family. Smokers and former smokers are at especially high risk. EPA recommends that you use an EPA or State-approved contractor trained to fix radon problems. You can call your state radon office to obtain information, including a list of EPA or State-approved radon contractors who can fix or can help you develop a plan for fixing the radon problem. Many questions you may have can be found in EPA's publication **"Home Buyer's and Seller's Guide to Radon"**.

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USEPA protocol describes two general types of radon measurements: short-term tests conducted from 48 hours up to 90 days, and long-term tests that last from 91 to 365 days. Your first test (initial/scneening) should be a short-term 'worst-case' scneening to see if there is a polential for high exposure to radon. Scneening tests should be conducted under closed-building conductions, in the lowest lived-in area in the house, because the highest concentrations of radon will usually be found in a room closest to the underlying soil. Tests made under these conditions are less likely to miss a house with a potential for high concentrations. On the other hand, if the results of worst-case scneening tests are very low, there is a high probability that the average annual concentrations in the house are also low.
