
4.1 Spotlight on Education-Centennial Elementary School


A great way to introduce the concepts of creativity and individual solutions to the same problem:

- · I had to do something so many times we do nothing!









Jason Hay, superintendent of LBL ESD said they are able to help out with running a survey for Scio School District as a third party.

Mr. Martinelli informed the Board that the district was in contact with Niki Kuykendall and Timbre White about the CTE Math and one of the things is Oregon a few years ago changed the math standards where we can offer a different path. CTE Math would be so great for our students. We would need approval of out of state travel for the 2 teachers to go to the conference for CTE Math. Dale Moon through LBCC might fund Timbre White conference and travel.
