


CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS


Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE


Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.


ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2020-21 graduating in 2023-24.




FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION



About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Our school offers several advanced courses. Many of these courses students earn dual credit through Linn Benton Community College. These courses include: English Composition, English Literature, Computers in Agriculture, Animal Science, Crops in our Environment Soils: Sustainable Ecosystems, Plant Propagation, Trigonometry, Differential Calculus, General Biology - Human Body, Basic Arc Welding, Education Practicum, Observation & Guidance, Child Development: Ages & Stages, College Algebra, Food Service and Sanitations, & Small Engines: Maintenance & Light Repair. Our school also offers Spanish 1-3 and we send students out to LBCC for more college coursework through our PACE program.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Our school offers many CTE opportunities for our students. Courses include: Family & Consumer Science, Agriculture Science & Technology, Welding & Fabrication, Forestry & Natural Resources, Design & Applied Arts, Woodshop. Among these CTE courses students have the option of receiving dual credit and receive special recognition at graduation: Culinary, Apparel, Agriculture, Welding, Forestry, Woodshop, Small Engine Repair, Photography, 2D/3D Mixed Media Art, Portfolio Development, & Autocad.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our school offers several academic focused extra curricular activities & Clubs: National Honors Society, Robotics, HPr3, Leadership, Art, Drama, Forestry, & FFA. Our school offers OSAA athletics: Football, Volleyball, Girls/Boys Basketball, Wrestling, Cross Country, Baseball, Softball, Track, & Cheer.
